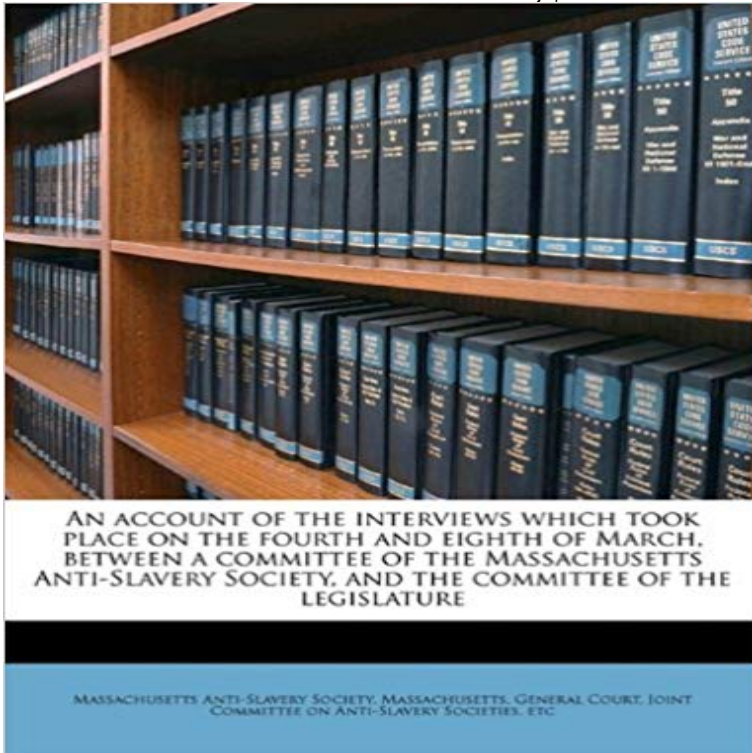


## An account of the interviews which took place on the fourth and eighth of March, between a committee of the Massachusetts Anti-Slavery Society, and the committee of the legislature
