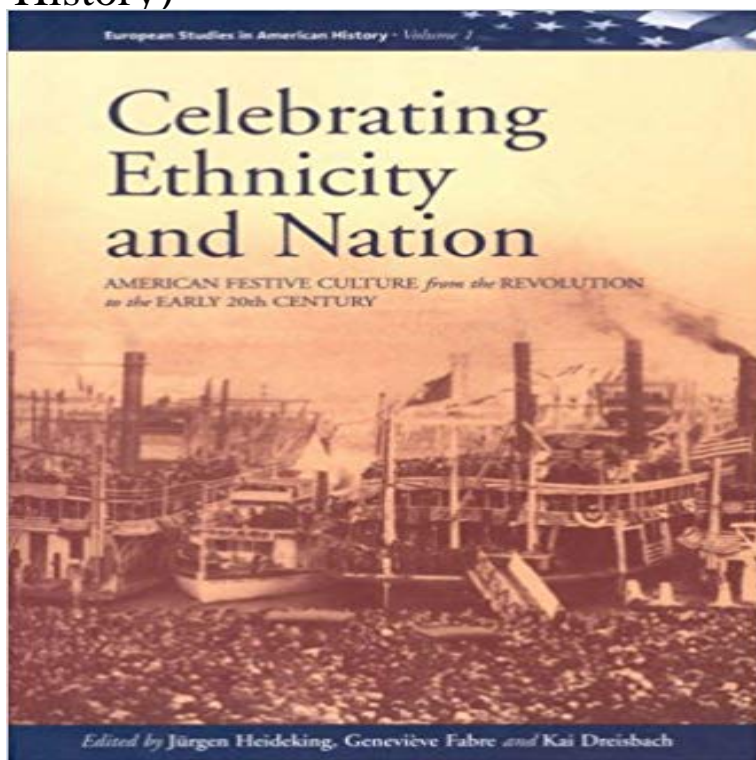


# Celebrating Ethnicity and Nation: American Festive Culture from the Revolution to the Early 20th Century (European Studies in American History)
