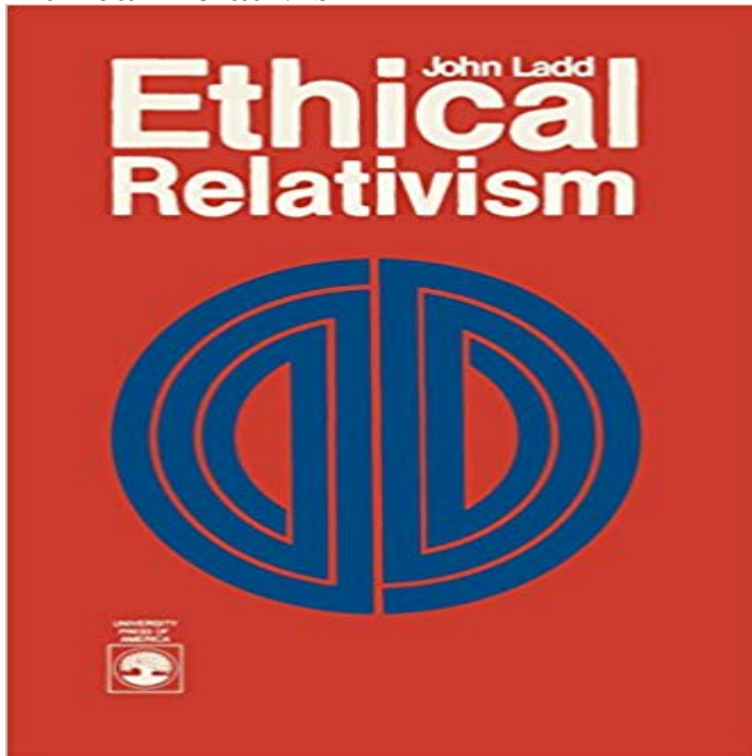


Ethical Relativism
